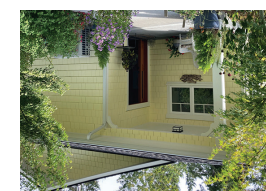

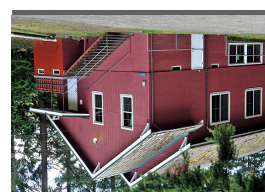

Today the Grange membership is focused on community service, and the building is used for a variety of community activities, classes, and events.

William Renton Lodge #29 of the Free & Accepted Masons of Washington continues a Masonic presence on Bainbridge Island which began in the mid 1800's with Kane Lodge. The local Masons purchased the land on High School Road and built a new lodge in 1957, after the original lodge building near Blakey Mill burned down in an accidental fire. The Masonic Temple is currently used for fundraising activities for local non-profits, various scouting organizations, and private events.
